

St Edward's School is a registered charity (309681) and as such is able to reclaim basic rate tax from HM Revenue & Customs (HMRC) on donations made by UK taxpayers who sign a Gift Aid Declaration. To qualify for Gift Aid, you must pay an amount of UK Income Tax and/or Capital Gains Tax at least equal to the tax that the charity reclaims on your donations in the appropriate tax year.

St Edward's School will reclaim 25p of tax on every £1 you give. The Government will pay to St Edward's School an additional 3p on every £1 you give between 6 April 2008 and 5 April 2011. This transitional relief for St Edward's School does not affect your personal tax position.

Information for UK Higher Rate Tax payers

If you pay higher rate tax, you can claim the difference between the higher rate of tax (40 per cent) and the basic rate of tax (20 per cent) on the total (gross) value of your donation to the charity.

For example, if you donate £100, the total value of your donation to the charity is £125 - so you can claim back 20 per cent of this (£25) for yourself. You can make this claim on your Self Assessment tax return if you were sent one.

Direct Debit Guarantee This guarantee is offered by all Banks and Building Societies that take part in the Direct Debit Scheme. The efficiency and security of the Scheme is monitored and protected by your own Bank or Building Society. If the amounts to be paid or the payment dates change, you will be notified at least 20 working days in advance of your account being debited or as otherwise agreed. If an error is made by St Edward's, or your Bank or Building Society, you are guaranteed a full and immediate refund from your branch of the amount paid.
